***There is a significant difference in the amount of unsheltered homeless people counted in 2005 and 2007 because of significant differences in the methodology used in the 2005 and 2007 point-in-time counts. In 2005, we conducted a street-based count,

which involved outreach teams canvassing key areas to count the numbers of people who were homeless and unsheltered that night. Because people experiencing homelessness are often difficult to find, we also utilized outreach team data collected throughout the year to develop an estimate of the number of unsheltered homeless on any given night. That estimate informed our 2005 point-in-time count estimate. In 2007, we conducted a services-based count rather than a street count; in a services-based count we count people as they access services. In addition, due to changes in HUD rules, we were not able to use outreach data to develop our estimate. We believe that the 2007 significantly undercounts the number of unsheltered people experiencing homelessness. For our next point-in-time count we plan to use a combination of a street count and services-based count approach which will hopefully help us count more homeless people who are unsheltered
